As a police officer and law enforcement trainer with the Carlisle Police Department, Mr. Hogarth is certified by the Pennsylvania Municipal Police

Officers' Education and Training Commission (MPOETC) as a general instructor, firearms instructor and application of force instructor. He has worked as a police officer since 1995 and a law enforcement trainer since 1997. He is employed by the Borough of Carlisle Police Department as a Patrol Sergeant and is currently the department's training coordinator and lead instructor.

In addition to serving as the department's lead instructor he is responsible for reviewing all "use of force" matters, providing his opinion to the Chief of Police regarding the justification or reasonableness of force used by all officers. He is also responsible for coordinating and or conducting new training programs commensurate with such findings. Prior to 2009, and for 13 years, Sgt. Hogarth served on the Cumberland County Special Response Team in the capacity of operator, sniper, firearms instructor, assistant team leader, team leader, assistant team commander and training coordinator.

Currently Sgt. Hogarth is a lead or adjunct instructor for several areas of instruction for the police basic training program at Harrisburg Area Community College (Act 120). Areas of focus for this training are: defensive tactics, patrol operations, report writing, patrol response to an active shooter and firearms.

Additionally Sgt. Hogarth has instructed other agencies and departments throughout the Commonwealth in the subjects of active shooter response, patrol tactics, defensive tactics, traffic stops, building searches, report writing and firearms. Mr. Hogarth has also been invited to be a speaker with the Cumberland County DUI/ARD program, the Pennsylvania Safe Schools Conference, the International Conference of Police Chaplains, and he currently sits on the curriculum committee for the Cumberland and Perry County Vocational and Technical School's Criminal Justice Program.

## **DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

### **CARLISLE POLICE DEPARTMENT**

**Patrol Sergeant:** Directly responsible for all activities and personnel of one of four shifts within the department. Duties include all daily activities, deployment, performance, evaluation and training of subordinates.

**Training Coordinator:** Oversees all in-house department training and trainers ensuring continuity and adherence to current national standards and practices in application of force issues and tactics. Reviews all reports of use of force and advises the Chief of Police regarding the justification and reasonableness of force used. Reviews and consults with the Chief on policy and procedure issues within the department.

**Special Response Team:** After serving as an operator and sniper on the county, multi-jurisdictional swat team Sgt. Hogarth assumed the position of lead firearms instructor and assistant team leader in 2004, and finished his tenure as the assistant team command/team leader as well as training coordinator.

In the role of team leader Sgt. Hogarth was responsible for the operations of the team equipment, the planning of missions or call-outs, and the deployment of personnel to achieve success. As assistant team commander, Sgt. Hogarth assumed the role of commander, when the commander was not available. In this capacity, he had overall tactical command during any incident the team was called for.

As training coordinator Sgt. Hogarth wrote the current policy and procedures currently in use by the team. He oversaw all training of personnel and coordinated the efforts of the training cadre to ensure continuity and safety. As a member of the team, he had the opportunity to train both a dignitary protection detail of the United States Army and a newly formed Lebanon County Emergency Services Unit in sub-machine gun tactics. He was responsible for training and qualifying all their personnel in select fire weapons.

#### **HARRISBURG AREA COMMUNITY COLLEGE (PART TIME INSTRUCTOR – ACT 120)**

**Firearms:** Currently serve as assistant firearms instructor teaching cadets both the fundamentals as well as more advanced shooting techniques they may need during their career in law enforcement.

**Defensive Tactics:** Currently serve as a lead defensive tactics instructor for the basic recruit curriculum in areas of intermediate force including chemical aerosol spray, collapsible baton, and pressure point and striking techniques.

**Patrol Operations:** As lead instructor for patrol operations Sgt. Hogarth oversees blocks of instruction involving traffic stops, dui enforcement, building searches and response to active shooter through situational exercises. In addition to that Sgt. Hogarth teaches classroom portions involving vehicular and pedestrian traffic and report writing.

#### **POLICE IN-SERVICE INSTRUCTOR**

**Firearms:** As a basic and select fire weapons instructor Sgt. Hogarth has instructed the department as well as outside agencies including the Office of the District Attorney, Cumberland County Adult Probation, Dickinson College

Department of Public Safety and the Pennsylvania Constables Training Program (Act 44).

**Patrol Tactics:** Mr. Hogarth worked with outside agencies as well as his own department to develop training curriculums and learning objectives to fit individual agency needs involving traffic stops, building search and room entry techniques, use of force issues and policy consultation. Such agencies include the Cumberland County Drug Task Force, the Cumberland County Sheriff's Department, Cumberland County Department of Probation and Parole and the U.S. Army Police stationed at the U.S. Army War College.

**Active Shooter Response:** As one of several instructors chosen by Harrisburg Area Community College to instruct the MPOETC Curriculum of Patrol Response to an Active Shooter, Mr. Hogarth instructed hundreds of officers throughout the Commonwealth in these tactics including private agreements to teach for the Pennsylvania Safe Schools Organization, the Cumberland County Safe Schools Group, Dickinson College Department of Public Safety, State College Borough Police Department and the South Central Terrorism Task Force.
